

We recommend that you :

1. Compare the history and experience of the School(s). How long has the location been opened?
2. Compare the cost of tuition and supplies, remember all schools must offer the same curriculum.
3. Make sure the school is licensed and accredited. An accredited school means they must comply with completion, placement and licensure rates, and follow additional academic guidelines and financial responsibilities.
4. Make sure you have received an estimated Financial Aid Award information before you sign an enrollment contract.
5. Make sure you know what portion of your financial aid is loans that you must repay and what portion is grants.
6. Does the school charge Interest and or Finance Fees on in school tuition payments?
7. Does the school charge a late fee if you are late on a payment while you are in school?
8. Does the school offer changes of enrollment schedules, do they charge you for the change?
9. Visit the school, choose where you feel most comfortable.
